Someone commented to Nathanael, "That diploma represents a lot of diligence and perseverance." With a look of appreciation, his response was an enthusiastic, "Indeed, it does!" We have had the opportunity to congratulate a number of 2017 college graduates, and they have all agreed with Nathanael.

As we reflected on the amount of time, energy and resources that a student must invest before finally reaching that milestone of receiving his/her diploma, it made us think of the ministry God has called us to in Loja, Ecuador. We often get frustrated by the slow progress in ministry. However, when we witness spiritual birth or a believer begins to make disciples of their own, God reminds us that it is worth all the effort.

- On February 25<sup>th</sup>, we received the shocking news that Jeff had experienced a *retinal detachment*. This introduced a lot of uncertainty into our lives. We wondered if we would have to postpone our home assignment. At the last minute, Jeff got a green light from the retina specialist in Quito to travel on March 13<sup>th</sup>.
- After a few days in the U.S., Jeff began to have problems again, and had to have a more *complicated surgery* done on March 20<sup>th</sup>. So the uncertainty continues. He has to be very careful as the eye heals, which is a very long process. Even after two months, it is still sore and weak. He would appreciate your prayers for healing and for patience.
- On May 11<sup>th</sup>, we took *Kaitlyn* to visit Asbury University, which will be her new home in August. She is more very excited, especially about the Equine Facilitated Wellness degree program.
- As we shared above, *Nathanael* graduated from Moody Bible Institute on May 13<sup>th</sup>. Please pray for him as he prepares to continue his studies at Canada Institute of Linguistics in Langley, BC, in August.
- Abby has really enjoyed seeing good friends in AL, TN and NC. Also, all the talk about graduating from college and entering college has motivated Abby to look into possibilities for the future. We are glad she is taking initiative and has some good ideas.

- We had a very *uplifting debrief* at the SIM USA headquarters the last week of March.
- The beginning of our *home assignment* has been very challenging, but it has been a joy to share with our ministry partners in person how God is transforming lives in Ecuador. It has also been a pleasure to catch up on what is going on in your lives. So far, we have visited individuals and churches in Alabama, Tennessee, North Carolina and Indiana. Thank you for ministering to us in so many ways!
- We are especially grateful for your *financial* support during the past couple of months, with all the travel we have done and the unexpected expenses related to Jeff's eye surgery.

## Financial Update

During our debrief at the SIM office, our support needs were reviewed and updated. Our monthly support need has increased since our last home assignment. Also, several ministry partners have had to discontinue support during this term, because of changes in their financial situation. A couple have gone home to be with the Lord. As a result, we need to raise an *additional \$1,600 in monthly support* before returning to Ecuador on September 7<sup>th</sup>. By faith, we bought round trip tickets, in order to be back in time for next semester at the university.

If we can increase our monthly support by \$120 each week, we will meet our goal. Please pray that we will soon discover the ministry partners God has in mind to provide this additional support.
